The aim of this workshop is to introduce participants to the concept of peer review for academic publishing and grant proposals. What is peer review, why peer review is necessary, how to engage with peer review and how to write up a peer review report are some of the topics which will be covered in the workshop. The workshop will be valuable to those academics wanting to engage with questions about academic quality, accountability and impact of their research. Practical tips on the process of peer review and publishing will be provided.

About Professor Nadar

Professor Sarojini Nadar is a Full Professor and leader of the Gender and Religion Programme at the School of Religion, Philosophy and Classics, UKZN. She has co-edited a total of five books, guest edited three accredited journals, is an editor of the DOHET accredited journal, Journal of Gender and Religion in Africa, and has had 16 chapters published in books nationally and internationally as well as 40 journal articles in national and international journals. She is a member of several international journal editorial boards including Journal of Feminist Studies in Religion, and Women's Studies International Forum. In 2012, she was named the overall Winner of the National Department of Science and Technology Distinguished Young Woman in Science Award: Human and Social Sciences.
