ABOUT THE PROGRAMME

Mentorship has long been regarded as an essential component in nurturing and developing Early Career Academics 'to grow into confident, competent, scholarly teachers.' Currently only a fraction of ECAs enjoy the benefits of mentoring at the UKZN.

The purpose of this initiative is to establish an environment that supports Mentorship by exposing 'senior' academics (who are willing to be trained as Mentors) to a set of generic and specific mentorship skills.

The Programme runs over 6 half-day workshops from March to November including 2 two-day retreats providing mentorship training on Teaching & Learning, and Research and Career Development using a tool/model designed for this purpose. The sessions also provide a valuable opportunity for sharing and networking.
